FINDING A LAWYER

There are many ways to find a lawyer. A good place to start is by asking business associates, other professionals such as your accountant, and friends for a recommendation.

Lawyers do not specialize in a particular field such as doctors, but many restrict their practices to specific areas of law. You should find a lawyer that has experience with your industry.

Another option is the Lawyer Referral Service run by the BC Branch of the Canadian Bar Association. This service will give you the name of a lawyer near you who has requested referrals. You can arrange a half-hour interview for \$25 plus tax. Call 604-687-3221 or 1-800-663-1919.
